Behavioral Health Services

Our Behavioral Health Services use evidence-based practices to help individuals and families reach their greatest potential. Services include a comprehensive array of mental health, addiction and co-occurring services. All of our behavioral health clinics are CARF accredited and accept Medicare, Medicaid, self-pay and most commercial insurances. Fees are adjusted on a sliding scale based on family size and income.

Addiction Services are given priority admission and preference to treatment in the following order:

- a. Pregnant Injecting drug users
- b. Other pregnant substance abusers
- c. Injecting drug users
- d. All other individuals with addictions



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Prevention Services

Northwest Louisiana Human Services District offers prevention services throughout the District directly and through contracted services. They are family-focused, evidenced-based, outcome-driven services which decrease and prevent addictive disorders and compulsive gambling.

Prevention uses evidenced-based curriculums, environmental strategies, coalition-building and other proactive and data driven strategies to prevent and reduce risk taking behaviors. Prevention programs are frequently implemented in school-based settings that teach problem solving, conflict resolution and refusal skills while promoting mental health wellness.

Developmental Disability Services

The Developmental Disabilities Office serves as the Single Point of Entry into the developmental disability services system which includes public and private residential services for people with developmental disabilities.

Waiver Services

Medicaid Home and Community –Based Waiver programs allow people greater flexibility to choose where they want to live and to use services' and supports that best suit their need. Waiver programs include: **Children's Choice, New Opportunities, Supports and Residential Options.**

Flexible Family Fund

Monthly stipends are provided to families of eligible children with severe or profound developmental disabilities from birth to 18.

Individual and Family Support

This program provides assistance for supports not available from other resources. Services are provided through contractual agreements by private provider agencies or through individualized agreements with individuals and families.
